VETS GAIN VALUABLE INFO AT DESOTO TOWN HALL & BENEFITS FAIR DeSoto Event Gives Veterans Shortcuts For Securing Better Services

DFW area Veterans who attended DeSoto's Town Hall Meeting and Benefits Fair on Saturday, March 30, 2019, likely expected to get some helpful information. But they probably didn't count on getting the large volume of candid, no-nonsense advice that was provided to them by our Town Hall panelists.

"I've been coming to these things for years but today I actually learned something!" said proud former U.S. Marine and 25-year DeSoto Police Veteran Officer Stacey Battle. "They knew first-hand the many challenges that Veterans face and gave us some really straightforward guidance that was very much appreciated."

DeSoto Mayor Curtistene S. McCowan, who opened and closed the Veterans Town Hall discussion, also came away with the feeling that the event went above and beyond for our Veterans. Said Mayor McCowan, "I'm extremely proud of DeSoto's Veterans and the sacrifices that they have made to keep us safe and free. I want them to understand DeSoto's commitment to honor them, respect them and serve them. I'm also proud of the job that our

panelists and supporting organizations did to provide them with the types of information that can really make a difference in their lives."

VA Clinical Psychologist Rodney C. Teague, PHD pointed out that the Dallas/North Texas VA's Mental Health Division has more than 600 employees standing by to serve our Vets and that they serve over 30,000 unique individual Veterans on an annual basis. Said Teague, "We've got every type of service that you could possibly want or need from an institutional mental health standpoint. Everything from acute psychiatric care to partial hospitalization, to residential programs for homelessness and substance abuse, to all kinds of outpatient services, to comprehensive homeless services, to specialty services for military sexual trauma and transitioning Veterans. The list goes on and on!"

The Town Hall Meeting also featured the forthright insights of two senior Dallas County judges who render Veteran related judgements every day. Judge Margaret Jones-Johnson said the courts make an effort to divert Veterans from being sent to jail and also ensure that Veterans in this jurisdiction get the help they need, even if they are only passing through the DFW area.

Judge Dominique Collins, who runs Dallas County's Veterans Court, thoroughly understands the hurdles that many Veterans face. She spent 12 years on active duty and noted that seven of those months were spent "in the sand" during the first Gulf War. She posed a rhetorical question to Vets in the audience asking if they knew why there were so many

Veterans in the State of Texas? Judge Collins promptly replied, "It's because they treat us well here. We've got the Veterans Land Board here and part of our lottery tickets go to help the Veterans. Texas treats its Veterans well, so we have a whole lot here and with all those Veterans comes all the stuff that comes with them." Judge Collins is also committed to helping Veterans in need of assistance. She invites them to her office located in the Frank Crowley Courts Building every Tuesday at 2pm where her staff helps Vets navigate the system. Annual Document Shredding and E-Recycling Event

DOCUMENT SHREDDING

DeSoto residents can bring documents to the DeSoto Service Center located at 809 W. Spinner Road for shredding on Saturday, May 4, 2019. There will be a mobile document shredding unit on-site from 9 am to 12 pm, (or until the trucks are full) to shred your personal household documents at no cost. IN THE EVENT OF RAIN, THE COLLECTION SITE WILL BE CLOSED IMMEDIATELY FOR SAFETY REASONS. This event is for DeSoto residents only. Participants will be required to show proof of residency, such as a drivers' license or utility bill, at the gate.

To participate, please follow the guidelines below:

- Place all documents in file boxes.
- Do not bring documents loose in bags; they must be placed in boxes ready for shredding.
- Commercial documents will not be accepted.
- Do not tape the lid on top of the file boxes.
- Bring no more than 5 boxes per resident.
- You will be able to watch your documents being shredded.

Boxes will be returned to residents for recycling. Once the event is over, any documents left at the location unattended or shredded will be considered illegally dumped.

ELECTRONICS WASTE COLLECTION

The e-recycling event will also take place at the DeSoto Service Center located at 809 W. Spinner Road on **Saturday, May 4, 2019,** from 9 am to 12 pm, or until the trailer is full. All items are collected FREE of charge.

The City of DeSoto is partnering with Goodwill Industries of Dallas to divert computers and related electronics donated during this event from area landfills and provides consumer education on the importance of environmentally-responsible computer disposal.
